AQUATIC DRAGON BOAT SHED AND TRAINING AREAS COVID SAFE PLAN

General Principles

- A COVID Safe Plan has been submitted for the Aquatic Dragon Boat Shed and Training Areas and is included in the attendance register folders.
- The maximum people permitted in the areas of Aquatic are:
 1. Boat Storage Area – **25**
 2. Warm up/Boat Preparation area – **250**
 3. Training areas
 - a. Aquatic – **1000**

Signage is posted indicating maximum occupancy.

Occupancy to be monitored by Member Clubs and COVID SAFE Officers

- Maintain the physical distancing principle of at least 1.5m separation where possible:
 - Between groups within the boat shed
 - At entry and exits
 - In boat preparation area
- No communal facilities (showers, change rooms) except toilets are available
- Allocated Training times must be adhered to i.e. must return and clean equipment within your time slot

Specific Details

COVID-19 Safe Officer

- Any group utilising the premises will have appointed a COVID-19 Safe Officer to ensure that the group remains compliant with this plan
 - Clubs to ensure COVID-19 SAFE Officer has back up (consider deputy COVID Safe Officers within your club)
- The COVID-19 Safe Officer will ensure that all persons who enter the premises complete the attendance register and are aware of the COVID-19 safe procedures in place

Physical Distancing

- Comply with physical distancing (1.5m separation where possible) and density requirements (1 person per 4 square metres)
- No person to enter the premises if they are unwell or have COVID-19 symptoms (signage displayed)
- Boats must be booked prior to attendance
- Compliance with physical distancing requirements is to be monitored by individual Member Clubs and COVID-19 Safe Officer
- Downloading of the COVID-19 safe app is encouraged

Hygiene

- DBSA will supply detergent for boat and equipment cleaning
- User groups to supply hand sanitiser
- When vacating the premises ensure touch points (door handles, push plates, padlocks, table tops etc) are environmentally cleaned and disinfected.
- Bathrooms will all have soap and hand drying facilities (paper towel or hand dryers only – no cloth towels)
- Provide hand sanitiser at the entry/exit points
- Signage on hand hygiene and cough etiquette is on display
- Participants to provide their own training equipment where practical
- Shared equipment to be cleaned between use

Response Planning

(Signage posted in boat storage area)

- A step-by-step summary of action to take is:
 1. Keep others away from the confirmed or suspected case. Talk to and assess the person concerned; if they need urgent medical help, call 000 immediately.
 2. If the person is at the premises when symptoms emerge, assess the situation and risks. Talk to the person about your concerns and next steps, and seek government health advice.
 3. If well enough, ask the person to go home, seek medical advice and testing for COVID-19, and self-quarantine until a result is returned. Ensure that the person has safe transport home: if not, you may need to arrange transport.
 4. Close the premises, ask all people in the building to leave and arrange for a full environmental and disinfection clean. Open doors and windows to increase airflow
 5. Notify DBSA to contact SA Health via healthcommunicablediseases@sa.gov.au to ensure they can trace any contacts of this person and contain the spread. SA Health may ask for the attendance records that you have kept to assist with this.
 6. SA Health will assess if anyone may have been exposed to COVID-19, and direct them to self-quarantine at home.
